

Saba Infraestructuras holds its Annual General Shareholders' Meeting

Barcelona, 14 May 2026

Saba Infraestructuras held its Annual General Shareholders' Meeting today in Barcelona, where the annual accounts for the 2025 fiscal year were approved and the main milestones of the year, marked by the integration into the Interparking Group, were discussed. The President of Saba, Salvador Alemany, and the CEO of Saba and the Interparking Group, Roland Cracco, outlined the company's key developments over the past financial year.

The Board has also agreed to authorise the acquisition of the company's own shares within the legally established limits, and the appointment of the auditor for the company's individual accounts for the 2026 fiscal year.

At the end of the 2025 financial year, Saba Infraestructuras operates in 196 cities across 8 countries, with a network of 1,098 parking facilities offering a total of 358,443 parking spaces and a workforce of 2,147 people.

In financial terms, the company generated revenues of €333 million, representing a 4.7% increase over the previous year. EBITDA stood at €137 million, whilst capital expenditure reached €33.2 million, mainly aimed at the improvement and modernisation of infrastructure, process digitalisation and the promotion of mobility-related solutions.

International growth and development

In 2025, Saba maintained its international positioning through the acquisition of new assets, refurbishments and the upgrading of existing infrastructures, among other key developments.

In Spain, noteworthy projects include the transformation of the Nuevos Ministerios parking lot (Madrid), with 157 spaces, into one of the main urban fast-charging hubs; the expansion of the Sant Joan de Déu Hospital car park (Barcelona), with 519 spaces; and the extension of the concession for the Port of Cambrils (Tarragona), with 291 spaces. Likewise, the comprehensive refurbishment of the Plaça Castella-Tallers car park (Barcelona) was completed, with more than 300 spaces.

Meanwhile, in Italy, Saba expanded its operations to include the management of the car park at Brindisi Airport, with around 2,000 spaces; the operation of the city centre car park in Lecce, with around 460 spaces; and new contracts in Rieti.

In Portugal, it took on the additional management of five airports in partnership with ANA Airports (53 car parks and a total of 6,900 spaces). In the hospital sector, it added the car parks at Braga Hospital (over 2,100 spaces), CUF hospitals (240 spaces) and Vila Franca de Xira Hospital (900 spaces). The operation also included urban and educational assets such as Gare do Oriente station (Lisbon), with 1,670 spaces, and the underground car park at the University of Lisbon, with 482 spaces.

In Chile, Saba renewed the contract with Parque Arauco for the management of car parks in seven shopping centres, with over 10,000 spaces, and signed a new contract with Parque Arauco Oriente. Additionally, it

incorporated the mixed-use car park at the Urbana Centro Apoquindo complex in Santiago, with around 1,500 spaces, and also took over the management of the car park at Clínica Meds.

In the United Kingdom, it expanded its operations in the hospital sector through new contracts with NHS Trusts, including those in Dorset and Milton Keynes, with more than 3,800 spaces. In addition, it maintained the management of the 10 car parks of the HS1 high-speed railway line, with more than 8,500 parking spaces.

In Germany, notable projects include the Kronsrode II urban development (Hanover), as well as refurbishments and technical upgrades to car parks in Aschaffenburg (around 1,400 spaces) and Hildesheim. In the Czech Republic, Saba signed a new contract with the TSK Praha local authority for the management and maintenance of 11 car parks in Prague, with around 1,700 parking spaces. Finally, in Slovakia, Saba carried out the comprehensive refurbishment of the Opera car park in Bratislava, with around 400 spaces.

Integration into the Interparking Group

Since 1 October 2025, Saba Infraestructuras has been part of the Interparking Group, one of the leading international car park operators, owned by long-term institutional shareholders AG Insurance, APG and CriteriaCaixa. At the end of 2025, Interparking Group operates in 15 countries, manages over 800,000 parking spaces in approximately 2,100 parking facilities and employs more than 4,300 professionals.

Interparking Group will maintain the Saba brand in selected markets, such as Spain and Andorra, Portugal, and Chile, among others. Furthermore, it has set an investment target of around €250 million, with a priority on strengthening growth in the Spanish market.

With the integration of Saba, the Interparking Group is expanding its international presence in the field of urban mobility, relying on a solid financial base and the progressive integration of operational, commercial, and technological capabilities. The resulting Group will continue to pursue a strategy focused on service quality, digitalisation, and sustainable mobility, with a particular emphasis on expanding electric charging and implementing solutions that enhance the customer experience and help reduce environmental impact.
